



This area has been home to the Anishinaabe, Haudenosaunee, and Wendat peoples for the longest time.

The Land Conservancy KFLA is an all-volunteer land trust dedicated to protecting places for nature. We currently own six nature reserves and hold conservation easements on two properties, providing habitat for 18 species at risk on 220 hectares (544 acres).

Our volunteers work to preserve vital habitat for species survival. Every penny the Land Conservancy receives from members, donors, and funders is used for land acquisition and stewardship.
